Nearly Indestructible Polymer Found from Alien Spacecraft

The bright streak of light in the February skies over Russia which left 52 people hospitalized, including 13 children, were reported to be meteorites between 60-100' in diameter.

However, the search for the meteorite parts at Chebarkul Lake has been stopped. The huge ice hole found at the lake on Friday "has formed because of a different reason," the Vice-Governor of

A U-shaped object is currently under inspection by Russian scientists, after being covertly removed under cover of night from the site.

Chelyabinsk region Igor Murog told Interfax-Ural.

The object is reportedly constructed of a highly durable polymer which is resistant to friction, heat, ultraviolet radiation, and is able to withstand temperature extremes.

More information on this possible alien spacecraft discovery will be released on April 1st.
