
Directions to May 13th Meeting

Gary Casterline opened the meeting at 4:06 PM with 4 members present.

Present: Gary Casterline, Jerry Blayne, Gary Petruska and John Sovis.

Treasurer's Report: Jerry Blayne distributed copies and reported. Beginning Balance = \$2,245.45, Income=\$0.19, Expenses = \$265.00, Ending Balance = \$31,980.64. Gary Petruska motioned to accept the report, John Sovis seconded and the motion carried.
